Thanks to You, We Just Keep Growing

Each year we look forward to reflecting on our impact and accomplishments as a charitable organization and sharing them with our program partners and community stakeholders.

This has been another incredible year at Strong Start and we must start by sincerely thanking all of you who have helped make this possible. We have welcomed new program partners, volunteers, donors and literacy champions to our goal of helping young children learn to read. We have renewed commitments and nurtured relationships with those of you who are already on this journey with us. From the start, it was our hope and dream that we would grow our programs so more children could have a Strong Start learning to read. Because of your commitment, that dream is becoming a reality.

Starting in 2001 as a community project using handmade games, expertly designed activities and a handful of volunteers in one school in Kitchener, Ontario, Strong Start has grown to a viable organization offering a continuum of programming for children from six months to nine years of age. We are active in six regions in Southern Ontario, supporting more than 5,000 children annually.

Many ingredients make up our recipe for success. Our dedicated volunteers are essential, and this past year nearly 3,100 of them gave 49,605 hours of their time. Strong Start finished the 2019 program year with 325 active program sites and this fall we are adding some 30 more.

Such growth would not be possible without our charitable donors and funders. As a children's charity that receives no direct government funding, we rely entirely on the generosity of our donors and grant makers to ensure we not only sustain what we have achieved, but also continue to grow our impact. We have welcomed local donors in new communities and even national organizations that are glad to be able to support us in multiple regions.

Among the many highlights of the year was the formation of the Strong Start Education Caucus at Queen's Park. This non-partisan caucus of MPPs is using its influence to raise awareness of the importance of early literacy and support the work and expansion of Strong Start in communities across Ontario. Conestoga College joined our rally this year by providing two Capstone teams who used their newly-minted education in technology development to help accelerate two major tech projects at Strong Start. And lastly, tech startup EPOCH shared its volunteer recruitment app to expand our engagement with corporate volunteers.

Impact that Lasts......

Ten Apples Up On Top

Easton's story as shared by his mother, Sarah

Easton is my handsome, sweet, oldest child with short brown hair, blue eyes and olive complexion. He's a thoughtful and energetic kid who loves math and hockey.

Bedtime stories were part of our daily routine and I could see him struggling to read on his own. When we went to the library, he would pick out a book he found interesting, but I would have to read most of it to him.

When Easton came home with the Strong Start letter, he was in speech therapy. We were happy that he was identified for the reading program and would be getting the help he needed to succeed.

He was enrolled in the Letters and Sounds strands. He looked at the program as an enjoyable activity and G

described his sessions as "reading and playing games." It was important to me that Easton did not view reading as a chore and that he would learn to enjoy reading. Reading is everywhere!

The improvements have been slow, but sure! I encourage him to read books that are recommended for his reading level, and also books he has already read, to help him gain some fluency. A few weeks ago, we were watching a Batman cartoon and I'd accidentally turned on the subtitles. I didn't realize it until Easton pointed to the TV and said, "Oh look Mom, Batman said this" He was reading the subtitles instead of listening to what was being said.



My "aha!" moment, however, came last summer when we were in the children's section of the new Chapters store in Cambridge. It was a rainy day and we were sitting at a round table. I was sipping on my Starbucks latte when Easton walked up to the table with "Dr. Seuss' Ten Apples Up On Top!" and read the whole book, cover-to-cover, on his own! He looked at me after he finished, beaming with pride, and asked if we could buy the book. To this day, he continues to reread this book as an old favourite.



Hudson Was Nervous, But Ready!

I first heard about the *Get Ready for School* program through a friend of a friend. As a stay-at-home mom, I always had Hudson with me, and I was worried he would not be ready for Kindergarten which was just a few months away. I shared my fears with my friend and she encouraged me to sign up for this program.

Right away, I could tell the program was benefiting him. The Instructors were wonderful and worked with us to ease his anxiety, engaging him in play as soon as he entered the classroom. Very quickly he started loving the program. At home, he would often sing the songs he learned in class. He went from not knowing many letters to knowing most of their sounds. He was always excited to read the little books. I could not have been happier. The program exceeded my every expectation. No longer was I worried about his transition to school.

On the first day of Kindergarten, Hudson was nervous but ready! He had a smooth start, which I believe is a direct result of his participation in *Get Ready for School*. He is enjoying school and doing very well. His teacher has shared with me how impressed she is with Hudson's attention span, focus, and determination to complete what he's asked to do. As one of the youngest children in the class, he is also more ready to read, and is now able to read some words in his story books.

Hudson changed from being a "watcher" to becoming a "doer." He is excited about learning and reading and feels confident enough to take risks. He has made new



friends in class and generally enjoys school. I am very proud of him.

I am eternally grateful to the *Get Ready* for School program. I plan to become a volunteer coach for the Letters, Sounds and Words program. I want to pay it forward and make a lasting difference in the life of a child, as the *Get Ready for School* program made such a difference for Hudson.



My Baby's Reading Journey

I first heard about the Baby Connections program, through a friend, when I was about nine months into my maternity leave. My daughter, Claire, was one of the older babies enrolled in the program at the Early Years Centre. Baby Connections is a wonderful opportunity for parents to learn how they can promote their children's early literacy development.

As a parent, I found the focus on early literacy particularly helpful. My husband and I were already reading to her at home, but the program helped me understand what markers and milestones to look for, on my child's developmental journey. For example, when Claire turns

the page of a book we're reading, her ability to do so, is a precursor to reading. Tips like these were a way for me to know she was developing at pace.

When her grandparents visited, she would share the book with them and point to the baby's eyes, nose, ears, etc. when asked. That book has been read so many times, it is now held together with tape!



I strongly encourage parents to sign up for Baby Connections. The program will benefit both you and your baby. It gets you out of the house and into a supportive environment with other parents. If that's not enough, you also get a book at the end of each session. I still can't believe that such a powerful program is free!

This past year saw the expansion of our programs.

In Waterloo Region, our Get Ready for School program expanded to Linwood and we added a program in Cambridge, bringing our total number to 20. Nearly 400 children attended this 88-hour program and gained letter-sound knowledge, grew their vocabulary, developed social skills and learned selfregulation, all essential building blocks for a successful entry to school and reading.

Conestoga Capstone Teams Bring Capacity and Tech Talent

On an evening in December 2018, during a pitch night at Conestoga College, students lined up for the chance to work with Strong Start. With the hopes of engaging one Capstone team, we were so heartened by the response that we took on two!

Strong Start engaged these teams to help launch two tech projects that will impact the Volunteer Coach experience. Strong Start relies on volunteers to deliver our *Letters, Sounds and Words* program, and this year we had more than 3,000 Volunteers helping over 4,000 children in this program.

Committed to continuous improvement, we launched two projects. The Volunteer Portal project will let trained volunteers watch tutorial videos on how to play the games and activities in *Letters, Sounds and Words*, and access Volunteer Coach positions posted by schools in their local communities. With this innovation we are confident that even more volunteers will be connected with the schools that need them, and volunteers will be able to perfect their coaching skills by having access to ongoing training.



The second project is a proprietary registration system where new coaches will be able to sign up for Volunteer Coach training sessions and directly create their volunteer profile in SiTE SOURCETM, Strong Start's proprietary database and program delivery system. This innovation is estimated to save more than 250 hours in data manipulation.

The two teams worked with Strong Start and our volunteer Senior Developer, Chris Howlett, to create the prototypes. The contributions of these skilled teams really helped kick-start the projects. Thank you to Conestoga College and the talented senior students who applied their skills to achieve an excellent product and road map for the future. Thank you to the Kitchener Waterloo Community Foundation for supporting these projects.
