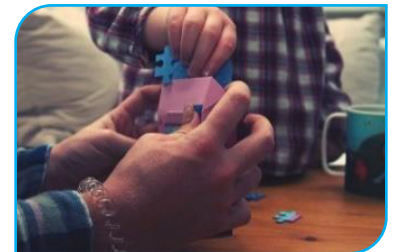
Let's see why...

- Connecting to your child's learning style can increase their ability to learn the skill that is a focus of the game or activity you are playing.
- Connecting to your child's learning style helps them to remember information and develop a deeper understanding of the world.
- Some of us learn best by **seeing** things, others by **hearing** and still others by **doing**.
- Some children learn best through music while others learn best outdoors or when using natural materials.



Let's get started...

- Verbal/Linguistic: I like to talk and read, have things explained to me, and listen to stories.
- Logical/Mathematical: I like to solve problems and puzzles, create things, and I am good at math.
- Visual/Spatial: I like to draw and paint, solve jigsaw puzzles, and create maps and cartoons.
- Bodily/Kinesthetic: I like to move! I am curious and like to participate in sports and being active. I like to be touching and moving things with my hands.
- Musical/Rhythmic: I like to sing and hum, and I work better when I listen to music.
- Naturalist: I like to be outside and I notice a lot of information about the natural world.
